- Primary sources of funding: property taxes (34%), tuition and fees (38%), state support (25%), other revenue (3%)

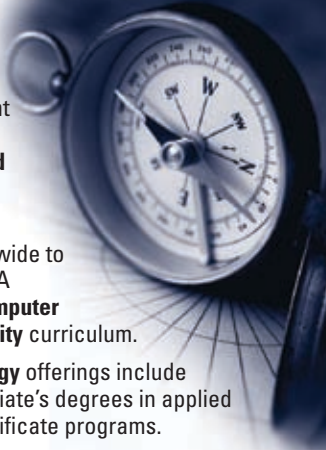

## *LCC Points of Pride*

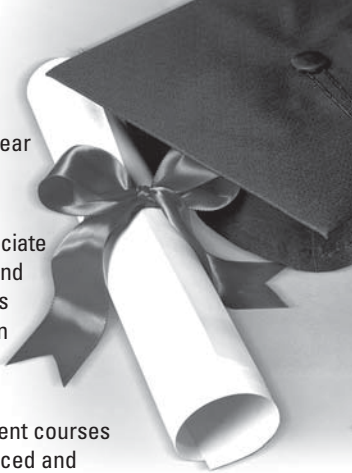
- LCC is the **third largest community college** (in enrollment) in Michigan, serving more than 30,000 students a year.
- Since 1957 **more than 500,000** people have taken classes at LCC.
- LCC is the **fifth largest employer** in the capital area, with more than 2,600 employees.
- LCC's **electronic campus** enables students to develop critical information-technology skills.
- 75 percent of regional **allied health professionals** were trained at LCC.
- LCC's **emergency medical technician** program is one of only two programs in the state that is nationally accredited and part of the National Registry.



- LCC graduates account for a large majority of the region's **police and fire personnel**.
- LCC is one of only 142 institutions nationwide to receive CNSS and NSA certification for its **computer networking and security** curriculum.
- LCC's **alternative energy** offerings include 10 courses, two associate's degrees in applied sciences and two certificate programs.
- LCC offers more than 200 courses **online** and has 15 associate's degrees and certificates that can be earned by students through online study.
- The **University Center at LCC** offers students the opportunity to earn bachelor's and master's degrees without leaving the campus.
- LCC offers students **international experiences** in China, France, Germany, Ghana, Ireland, and Korea.

## *LCC Programs*

- Two-year transfer programs to four-year colleges and universities
- More than 240 associate degree (two year) and certificate programs (less than 2 years) in a variety of career paths
- Nearly 2,500 different courses taught by experienced and educated professionals who have real-world experience
- Evening, weekend and variable schedule classes
- 3+1 articulation agreements with Capella University, Central Michigan University, Davenport University, Eastern Michigan University, Ferris State University, Franklin University, Lake Superior State University, Northwood University





and Siena Heights University, which provide three years of education at LCC and one year at the four-year college

- International programs that provide (1) international exchange and study abroad programs and (2) instruction on the English language and American culture to LCC international students
- More than 40 campus organizations and student clubs

## Visiting LCC

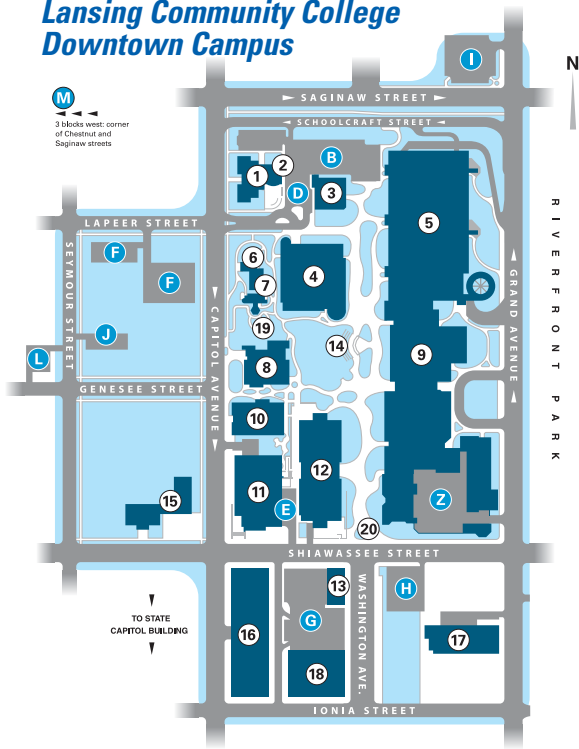
- LCC's **Downtown Campus** is located in Lansing and consists of 48 acres covering seven city blocks and 1.1 million square feet of building space.

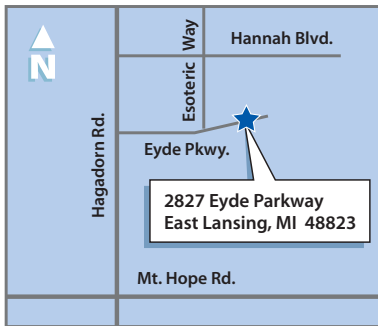

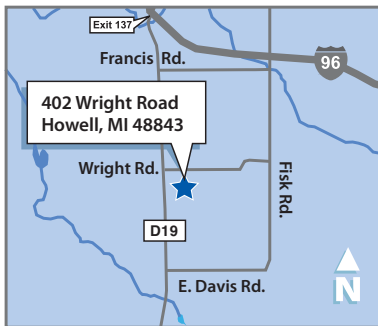

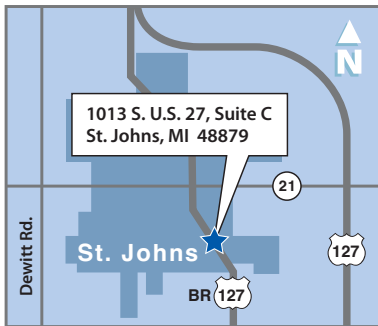
